University College London Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (UCLH) is one of the most complex NHS trusts in the UK, serving a large and diverse population. In July 2004, we were one of the first NHS trusts to achieve Foundation Trust status.

We provide academically-led acute and specialist services, to people from the local area, from throughout the United Kingdom and overseas.

Our vision is to deliver top-quality patient care, excellent education and world-class research. We provide first-class acute and specialist services across seven sites:

- University College Hospital (incorporating the Elizabeth Garrett Anderson Wing)
- National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery
- Eastman Dental Hospital
- Royal National Throat, Nose and Ear Hospital
- Royal London Hospital for Integrated Medicine
- University College Hospital Macmillan Cancer Centre
- The Hospital for Tropical Diseases

We are dedicated to the diagnosis and treatment of many complex illnesses. UCLH specialises in women's health and the treatment of cancer, cardiac, infection, neurological, gastrointestinal and oral disease. It has world class support services including critical care, imaging, nuclear medicine and pathology.

We are committed to sustainability and have pledged to become a carbon net zero health service, embedding sustainable practice throughout UCLH. We have set an ambitious target of net zero for our direct emissions by 2031 and indirect emissions by 2040.

The Clinical Coding Department is a part of the Performance and Planning Directorate which also consists of Performance and Information Departments that are responsible for all Trust management information, reporting both externally and internally, as well as commissioning services and systems support. The Performance and Information departments also provide vital management information to clinicians and managers that is the heart of decision making across the Trust.

The Clinical Coding Department is responsible for the collection of diagnosis codes, using the ICD-10 classification, and procedure codes using the OPCS-4 classification, extracting relevant information from patient clinical records. This data is used to collect information on all patients admitted to the Trusts hospitals and for financial reimbursement of this care.

The main Clinical Coding Department is centrally located at the main UCH campus, however there are also clinical coders based within Divisions at the National Hospital of Neurology and Neurosurgery and the RNTNE Hospital.

The Clinical Coding Team consists of 21 Clinical Coding Liaison Officers, who are responsible for the clinical classification of approximately 189,000 FCEs (Finished consultant Episodes) including inpatient and daycare episodes a year.

Due to the implementation of Payments by Results, the importance of clinical coding has increased significantly with an approximate income of over £250M reliant on accurate coding of inpatient and daycare activity.

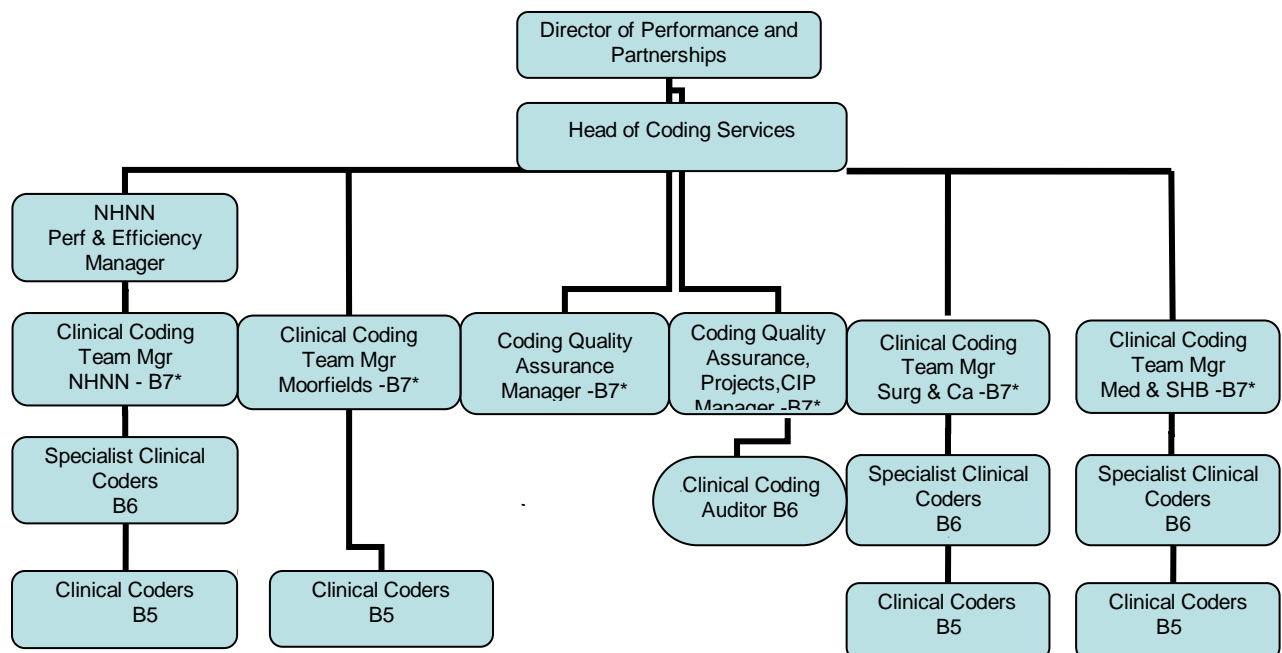
As UCLH is a tertiary referral Trust the types of cases presenting to the Trust hospitals are generally of a higher complexity to many other trusts and require experienced and highly knowledgeable Clinical Coders.

Job Purpose

- The post holder is responsible for providing high quality and timely coded clinical data. This requires the application of all coding rules and conventions pertaining to ICD-10 (International Classification of Diseases, Version 10) and OPCS-4 (Classification of Interventions and Procedures), incorporating national standards as set down in the Clinical Coding Instruction Manual ICD-10 and OPCS-4.

- Clinical Coding has a crucial role in the management of the hospital for contractual/billing purposes, due to the implementation of Payment by Results and is a source of healthcare data for the Department of Health (DOH) and World Health Organisation (WHO).
- With formal training, the post holder would have the initiative to locate the necessary medical information via clinical systems for the coding to be completed within timeframes. Ability to organise and prioritise workloads, meet deadlines and tackle problems systematically is of paramount importance.

Key Results Areas

- The Clinical Coding Team aims to deliver 100% of patient episodes to be clinically coded by locally set monthly deadlines. If this is not fulfilled the Trusts cash flow could significantly be impacted.
- Participate in a comprehensive training and professional development programme to keep-up-to date with changes in both national standards and local policies.
- Trust-wide promotion of the clinical coding function, in particular with clinical and divisional staff.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide accurate, timely and complete clinical coding to the directorates for all specialities across the trust.
- Participate in regular training sessions in order to develop and enhance coding speciality skills.
- Update national classification books and manuals in line with national standards released by the NHS Classification Service. For example Coding Clinics and errata's.
- Participate in monthly audits of completed work with the Lead Auditor in order to provide accurate coding standards, whilst routinely attaining the Trusts correct percentage targets.
- Demonstrate a high level of skills in the use of International Classification of Diseases, volume 10 (ICD-10) and the Classification of Interventions and Procedures, (OPCS-4.10).
- Supervise new Clinical Coders in conjunction with the Team Managers to bring them up to the required level of competence including the monitoring of incomplete episodes reports.
- Liaise with the Information Department with regards to timeframes for the completion of coded data.
- Identify and report errors found on the EPIC (EPR) system e.g. incorrect consultant designation.
- Work with specialty divisions to support and maintain a professional and flexible coding service.
- Ability to code all specialties and to rotate as and when required, with appropriate support and training.
- In line with Data Security & Protection Toolkit (DSPT) requirements underpinning coding standards, all coders are expected to regularly attain 95%+ coding accuracy in primary diagnostic and procedural coding.
- To ensure consistency in timeliness and delivery of the Trusts coding deadlines, each coder is expected to code FCE numbers in line with minimum specialty targets.
