We are looking for a Locum Consultant in Occupational Medicine to provide consultation, advice and guidance as part of the multidisciplinary team within East Kent Hospitals University NHS Foundation Trust's (EKHUFT) Occupational Health (OH) Department. The multi-disciplinary OH Department is committed to achieving and sustaining high quality services and has been SEQOHS accredited since 2013. It is innovative in developing the service delivery model, and dedicated to staff training and development.

The postholder will undertake consultations with staff employed by EKHUFT as well as by contract to other NHS Trusts and employers, in line with the agreed criteria and pathways; providing evidence-based advice for the OH department.

We offer up to 32 days' annual leave and active support for study, quality improvement and patient safety work as part of our 'We care' improvement journey, and medical education and research.

The successful applicant will be required to work at least 4 clinical sessions of Programmed Activity per month, including Supported Professional Activity (SPA) and support the supervision of trainees. The sessions can be timetabled flexibly with the successful applicant. Working in conjunction with the multi-disciplinary team, the postholder will provide occupational medicine assessments, providing advice to individuals and their referees in line with evidence-based practice and legal requirements.

The occupational health service has SEQOHS accreditation. This will provide the postholder with the opportunity to be involved in the implementation of standards, professionalism, and drive to improvement. The department is comprised of an Occupational Health Lead, Medical Staff, Occupational Health Advisors, Occupational Health Specialist Nurses, Vaccination Team, Occupational Therapists, Manual Handling Practitioners and supported by Business, Data and Administrative staff. The department works closely with the People & Culture team, the Health and Safety and, Infection Prevention and Control teams.

The Occupational Health Department provides health and wellbeing services to all staff employed by East Kent Hospital University NHS Foundation Trust as well as by contract to other NHS Trusts and employers. These contracts currently include local government, education and small & medium sized enterprises. The Consultant will work closely with the Head of OH to ensure a safe, efficient, and effective service.

While primarily responsible for delivering a quality clinical service, the Consultant in Occupational Medicine is also expected to support the strategic development of the service, providing advice on current and projected legislation and working with the current Consultant and Head of Occupational Health to support the development of departmental and relevant Trust wide policies and procedure

We will work with you to shape the ideal job plan upon successful appointment, and review it with you after three months and then annually – so you can keep the perfect fit.

We will also provide the essential resources to support you in your duties, including administrative support.

Role specific duties

- To take an active role in maintaining and developing high quality occupational health services in line with best evidence-based practice and legal requirements.
- To undertake regular occupational medicine clinics covering a wide range of complex occupational health issues, including legal and/or employment issues and ill health retirement applications. (For NHS, Local Authority, Teachers and private pension applicants.) To ensure that assessments are undertaken in accordance with agreed contracts and with national or departmental standards.



- To provide clear and timely advice to managers, employees and HR. To attend case conferences and provide guidance on trends and organisational risk factors.
- To maintain confidential and contemporaneous health records and reports in line with legislative and professional standards on the OH IT systems.
- To provide a role in the delivery and compliance of occupational health services health surveillance programme.
- To provide advice to the organisation on medical assessment of new employees in line with the provisions of the Equality Act, immunisations, statutory medical examinations and clinical assessments for fitness to work.
- To advise the Trust on ethical matters in relation to occupational health and safety and employment.
- To take a role in delivering the teaching, training and clinical supervision activities of the department and offer accessible and timely assistance to the OH clinical team to deliver effective occupational health services.
- To attend and report to the relevant strategic and site-based meetings including the infection control committee and the health and safety group in the absence of others.
- To ensure good relationship and effective liaison between clients, managers, human resources, business partners, employee relations, health and safety, manual handling, infection control & other Trust specialists and GPs.
- To support and advise in the development of departmental & relevant Trust wide policies and procedures.
- To advise the Trust on working /environmental conditions and undertake workplace assessments so as to minimise the risk of occupational related disease.
- To lead and participate in the MoHaWK audit, implement improvements and lead service reviews.
- The post holder may be required to participate in both undergraduate and post graduate training, supporting the clinical supervision of Specialist Registrar trainees and the training and education of the clinical staff in the speciality.
- To be familiar with and advise the Trust on current and projected legislation related to occupational health and safety.

The small print

The post will be appointed to under the Terms and Conditions of Service for Hospital Medical and Dental Staff. You are required to be fully registered with the General Medical Council and on the Specialist Register or eligible for inclusion on the Specialist Register within six months of the date of interview.

The passing of a medical examination is a condition of employment.

You will be required to reside not more than 30 minutes away from your base, unless specific approval is given by the Chief Executive and Chief Medical Officer. You will need to be able to be contacted by the Trust at all times.

Every Consultant must adhere to the Trust policies and procedures including documentation of all activity both in outpatients and theatre.

How to apply

This fixed term contract will only be agreed for the maximum term of 24 months with purpose of enabling you to complete your portfolio pathway (formerly CESR) application. During this period, we expect therefore that you positively and actively engage in this process and provide periodical evidence to confirm activity against this requirement cumulating into submitting your application in advance of the end of this contract. If you do not fully complete the pathway by the end of the contract or provide evidence when requested that you are taking steps to complete the pathway application, then your employment contract will be terminated.
