JOB PURPOSE

• To Provide urgent high-quality, short-term programs of care for vulnerable adults in their own home with acute health needs, and to facilitate timely discharge from urgent and acute care settings.

- Work within professional standards and clinical guidelines, promote best practice and to undertake all aspects of clinical duties as an autonomous practitioner including assessing and treating own caseload of patients/clients and maintaining professional documentation.
- To work as part of a multidisciplinary team to facilitate timely assessment and co-ordinated discharge planning, liaising with appropriate team members when patient's are acutely unwell.
- To hold responsibility for own caseload, working with and without direct supervision.
- Provide support, teaching and clinical supervision for other team members, student Occupational Therapists.
- To work flexibly, being willing to work on other Unplanned Care pathways when required.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Clinical

- To undertake specialised multi-professional assessments, develop and implement treatment plans for clients referred to the Unplanned Care services. These clients will present with a variety of complex multi-pathologies within specialist areas, including neurological conditions.
 - Participate in triaging referrals and allocation of visits appropriately.
 - To communicate relevant medical information, assessment details, advice and recommendations across agencies and with clients in compliance with trust guidelines for sharing of information and informed consent.
 - Following specialist assessment, to use advanced clinical reasoning, analysis, assessment and reassessment skills and using a client-centered goal setting approach, to develop and provide individual occupational therapy treatments and programmes for clients. These treatment techniques may include functional activities, manual occupational therapy treatment techniques or patient and care giver education.
 - To demonstrate compassion, empathy and sensitivity towards clients who may have complex emotional and
 physical conditions such as fear of falling, anxiety, pain and other physical, psychological and social concerns
 or when delivering unwelcome news around their condition or rehabilitation prognosis.
 - To comply with local risk assessments when dealing with complex clients with challenging behavioural needs and high risk environments.
 - To be responsible for organising and prioritising own caseload to meet service needs and to communicate with your supervisor if the service needs cannot be met.
 - To prescribe appropriate equipment to clients in order to maximise their independence and safety.
 - Travel to client's homes taking necessary assessment and treatment equipment as required.
 - To work as a lone practitioner, within the guidelines of the Lone Working Policy, when performing home visits.
 - To identify clients who need support from outside agencies, using clinical reasoning and analysis skills. To liaise with, and to refer clients to these services which include other Healthcare Services, Social Services and Voluntary agencies as appropriate.
 - To participate in 7 day working.
 - To contribute to and participate in training events with other members of the team.

Management / Leadership

• To support the members of the team in the day-to-day operation of the service. This may include answering queries, fielding referrals, contributing to team discussions, responding to client needs, delegating and



- supervising appropriate tasks to Rehabilitation Assistants and administrative staff, communicating with other team members and outside agencies and other operational activities.
- To maintain close working relationships with all primary care and social care agencies, Accident & Emergency
 departments, specialist community and secondary care services and therapy services active within CLCH;
 accepting and making referrals to these groups as needed.
- To participate in the multi-professional team meeting within each service area, actively contributing and chairing as required.
- To respond to inconsistent work patterns and to be able to manage a diary and re-priorities as required.
- To provide clinical supervision, appraisal and competency attainment for the rehabilitation support workers/ occupational therapy students in the team, by providing theoretical and practical clinical training, education sessions and advice on client needs and treatments.
- Participate in the development, implementation and review of policies, guidelines, and integrated care pathways and/or service redesign of intermediate and community care services.

Educational

- To develop, update and present occupational therapy specific education presentations to other health professionals, clients and carers.
- To attend appropriate education and training programs to develop/maintain enhanced clinical skills.
- To participate in the induction of new staff, in house training, support of colleagues, students, medical staff, AHPs and others as required.
- To participate in the student placement program, and following appropriate training, be responsible for student supervision and teaching.

Research and audit

- To participate in and lead on clinical and organizational audit and research activities.
- To critically evaluate and interpret evidence-based research findings from diverse sources, making informed judgments about their implications for developing or re-designing services and clinical practice.

Professional

- To be responsible for maintaining detailed and accurate patient treatment records in line with RCOT and legal standards.
- To be responsible for complying with legal and professional confidentiality guidelines at all times.
- To be professionally and legally accountable for all aspects of own work ensuring that the standard of professional work meets professional standards and clinical guidelines.
- To actively participate in CLCH Appraisal Scheme, both as an appraiser and appraise, by identifying key
 performance objectives and continuing education needs.
- To actively participate in both clinical and operational supervision sessions with your supervisor and to identify and develop professional, clinical and service needs.
