



Facts About Salisbury

Salisbury is a cathedral city in Wiltshire, Since the late 16th century, the spire of Salisbury Cathedral has been the tallest in England. The city is approximately 20 miles from Southampton and 30 miles from Bath. You will also find Stonehenge just 9 miles from Salisbury.



Salisbury railway station is the crossing point of the West of England Main Line, from London Waterloo to Exeter St David's. Great Western Railway hourly trains call from Cardiff Central, Bristol Temple Meads, Bath Spa to Southampton Central and Portsmouth Harbour.



Salisbury's Charter Market is one of the oldest in the UK. It has been running since 1227. It's not just the market that has been running for a very long time, Salisbury's fair is also one of the longest running in the country. In 1227, King Henry III granted a Charter to the Bishop of Salisbury to hold a fair on the third Monday in October and it's happened every year since.

It is a very sporty city with the city has a football team, Salisbury F.C., who are based at the Raymond McEnhill Stadium, on the northern edge of the city. Salisbury Rugby Club, play in Southern Counties South. South Wilts Cricket Club and Hockey Club is based at the Salisbury and South Wiltshire Sports Club and play in the Southern Premier Cricket League.
